I write to express my deep concern regarding the recent decision to award a black&write! Writing Fellowship to author Karen Wyld.

Ms Wyld has previously made public statements expressing sympathy for Hamas, a proscribed terrorist organisation under Australian law. Such comments are incompatible with the values of respect, unity, and inclusion that the State Library of Queensland must uphold.

The Premier and I have been unequivocal in stating that there is no place for hate, discrimination, or racism – including antisemitism – in Queensland. The Crisafulli Government supports the arts as a platform for creativity, expression, and cultural engagement.

While we respect the right of individuals to express their views, we also acknowledge the importance of ensuring that publicly funded arts venues and programs remain inclusive and focused on celebrating artistic excellence. It is the Government's view that Ms Wyld is not a fit and proper person to receive the award at the State Library of Queensland.

While I support the principles of free expression and creative diversity, publicly funded venues – including the State Library of Queensland – must be held to the highest standards. Any perception that taxpayer-funded awards are being granted to individuals who express views that justify terrorism undermines public confidence in our institutions and the broader cultural sector.

I will continue to work with arts organisations and stakeholders to ensure that the use of our venues aligns with community expectations and remains focused on celebrating artists for their achievements.

Ms Wyld has previously made public statements supporting the person responsible for the horrific Hamas-led October 7 attacks and expressing sympathy for a proscribed terrorist organisation under Australian law.

The statements include, "Vale to the martyr Sinwar," and "Resisting colonisation until his last breath, fighting the genocidal oppressors like a hero, sacrificing his life for love of his people and ancestral land."

Such comments are incompatible with the values of respect, unity, and inclusion that the State Library of Queensland must uphold and providing this individual with a public platform will cause grave distress to our community.

The Premier and I have been unequivocal in stating that there is no place for hate, discrimination, or racism – including antisemitism – in Queensland. The Crisafulli Government supports the arts as a platform for creativity, expression, and cultural engagement.

While we respect the right of individuals to express their views, we also acknowledge the importance of ensuring that publicly funded arts venues and programs remain inclusive and focused on celebrating artistic excellence. It is the Government's view that Ms Wyld is not a fit and proper person to receive the award at the State Library of Queensland.

While I support the principles of free expression and creative diversity, publicly funded venues – including the State Library of Queensland – must be held to the highest standards. Any perception that taxpayer-funded awards are being granted to individuals who express views that justify terrorism undermines public confidence in our institutions and the broader cultural sector.

I will continue to work with arts organisations and stakeholders to ensure that the use of our venues aligns with community expectations and remains focused on celebrating artists for their achievements.



On behalf of the Library Board of Queensland and State Librarian and CEO, I would like to thank you for your 16 May 2025 letter raising your concerns regarding the decision to award a black&write! Writing Fellowship to author Karen Wyld.

The challenges faced by governments and cultural institutions in relation to issues of this nature are complex, increasing in frequency and require a nuanced and collaborative response. I thank you for your willingness to engage in a frank and open discussion as State Library has navigated the awarding of the 2025 black&write! Writing Fellowships.

Having given much consideration to the matter, the Library Board endorses the decision to award a 2025 black&write! Writing Fellowship to Karen Wyld.

The Library Board is confident that due process has been followed in assessing and awarding the 2025 black&write! Writing Fellowships. An independent judging panel has unanimously selected the manuscripts based on their literary merits. These applications comply with all conditions of entry.

The Library Board has some concerns around our compliance with the *Human Rights Act 2019* (Qld) and in particular, the protected attribute of political belief and activity. The current application process does not outline any social media code of conduct or indicate that the personal views of an applicant would be considered as part of the judging process. State Library makes clear in contracts and at events personal views and opinions do not reflect or represent the views or positions of State Library.

The Library Board has committed to a review of the black&write! process in the context of the full suite of awards and fellowships administered by State Library.

We look forward to continuing this important work to strengthen our shared commitment to intellectual freedom, artistic expression, and public trust in our cultural institutions. 

I refer to your 19 May 2025 letter issuing a direction under s 23 of the *Libraries Act 1998* (Qld) to the Library Board that Ms Wyld not receive the black&write! Writing Fellowship Award (the Direction).

We are mindful to ensure we comply with the Direction issued to address your concerns.

To ensure compliance with the Direction, the Library Board of Queensland took urgent and immediate steps to ensure that Ms Wyld was not awarded the black&write! Writing Fellowship. A decision was also made, in consultation with Arts Queensland, that today's 2025 black&write! Writing Fellowship awards ceremony would not proceed.

We will make arrangements for the 2025 black&write! s 47(3)(b) - Contrary to Public Interest and other 4 shortlisted applicants to receive their awards in the future.

I confirm we are urgently seeking legal advice on the available options to minimise the risks and damages associated with a failure to comply with the terms of the executed Writing Fellowship Agreement and our partners Creative Australia and University of Queensland Press.

Messaging on QLAs

- Delivered by the State Library and supported by Queensland Government investment through Arts Queensland since 2015, the Queensland Literary Awards celebrate outstanding writers from Queensland and around Australia, across published and unpublished categories. The awards recognise the extraordinary talent of writers at all stages of their career.
- They also offer fellowships and development awards for Queensland writers, and emerging Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islanders writers nationally.
- The work of the state's writing sector – from page, to stage, to screen - plays a critical role in engaging Queenslanders and supporting life-long learning, sharing powerful narratives that challenge or entertain, and share our unique stories to global audiences.

Background

- Queensland Government funding was withdrawn from the Queensland Premier's Literary Awards (QPLA) in 2012.
- The writing sector independently reestablished the former awards into the Queensland Literary Awards and they were delivered by an independent body in 2012 and 2013 with funding by sponsors, donors and crowd funding.
- Since 2014 the QLAs have been managed by SLQ.





Good afternoon, Sam from the Minister's office passed on this email address.

I'm a journalist with *InReview* South Australia, and am currently working on a report about the State Library of Queensland's decision to rescind a black&white! Fellowship from one of the 2025 winners, K.A. Ren Wyld.

I've read the minister's comments to Parliament from Tuesday but was wondering if he had any additional statement to make beyond what's been written in *The Australian*?

Here are some questions:

- When did the minister and/or the premier write to the State Library of Queensland's management?
- What was the nature of that request or direction?
- The minister's statement in parliament referred to a Tweet which has since been deleted; can your office provide any detail of that Tweet or how it was brought to the minister's attention?
- Was any right of reply given to the author in question before being stripped of the award and funding?
- In Parliament the Minister said that the black&white! program "uplifts Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander writers" and "must be protected, strengthened and undermined". Given the awards process was led by a First Nations judging panel, a First Nations-led team, with strong buy-in from the community, were any steps taken to consult with the judges, black&white! team or broader Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community before overruling the process?

My deadline is 9am tomorrow morning, any additional comment is much appreciated.

Hi media team, a story is due to go live this morning re the decision to withdraw Wyld's fellowship, i have included the statement posted by Vicki McDonald yesterday. If she would like to respond to the following allegations made by Wyld in the paragraph below, please respond as soon as you are able. Many thanks.

Wyld says she was ushered into a private room, where the state library's chief executive Vicki McDonald informed her that her scholarship, and a publishing contract that had already been signed by both parties, had been cancelled.

"She wouldn't tell me why or who was doing it...whether it was from the minister or the board," Wyld told the Guardian. "She just said it didn't come from her."

Wyld said she pointed out to McDonald that the withdrawal of the fellowship would add to an already increasingly divisive public debate over the attempt to silence artists' voices over their stance in the Gaza conflict.

McDonald said, words to the effect: "That's a risk we've decided that's worth taking."

Approved Response:

In the Queensland parliament yesterday, Minister for Education and the Arts John-Paul Langbroek stated the Queensland Government had "taken the decision that this award should not be presented at the State Library".

Based on that decision, State Library of Queensland yesterday postponed the black&write! ceremony.

K.A. Ren Wyld, who was due to receive one of the fellowships, was asked to meet with the State Librarian and CEO on Tuesday morning (21 May).

The decision to rescind her fellowship was respectfully communicated to the writer at that time.

Extra questions: received 12:30 pm 21 May

Can you also confirm that yesterday's black&write ceremony has been indefinitely postponed?

The award ceremony will be rescheduled at a date to be determined.

Also the library statement says it is "committed to undertake an independent review of the suite of awards and fellowships we administer". Does this mean the Unaipon award has also been put on hold. What other awards/fellowships will be reviewed?

The David Unaipon award is part of the Queensland Literary Awards. These awards have not been put on hold.

The review will include all awards and fellowships administered by State Library of Queensland including the Queensland Literary Awards and the Queensland Memory Awards.

Also can you confirm that funding for the black&write! comes from Creative Australia and the Copyright Fund?

black&write! is supported by the Copyright Agency's Cultural Fund and the Australian Government through Creative Australia, its principal arts investment and advisory body.

Crikey enquiry (s 47(3)(b) - Contrary to Public Interest) **Media Reporter)**

I hope you're well. My name's [REDACTED] I'm the media reporter at Crikey. I'm getting in touch in respect of the withdrawal of a black&write! Fellowship from Karen Wyld, who I understand was shortlisted for the Fellowship this year. I trust you're familiar with the report in The Australian newspaper in relation to it. To that end, I had a number of questions - I'm working to a midday deadline for our lunchtime edition. If you have any further remarks they are most welcome.

Was The Australian newspaper briefed by the State Library of Queensland on the withdrawal of the Fellowship ahead of Ms Wyld being informed of the rescinding by Vicki McDonald?

State Library follows a Media protocol and did not brief any journalists on the rescinded fellowship before it was discussed with K.A. Ren Wyld.

The decision was respectfully communicated to the writer as a priority.

Who sits on the panel responsible for the shortlisting, awarding and withdrawal of Fellowships?

The black&write! Fellowships were decided by an expert panel of respected judges. The names of judging panels are not released by State Library.

The judges were not involved in rescinding K.A. Ren Wyld's fellowship.

Do any government ministers hold the power to rescind Fellowships by discretion? I understand the Queensland Premier and state Arts Minister has written to the State Library in relation to this matter. Does the Federal Arts Minister have the discretion to rescind awards through the relationship with Creative Australia? Provide detail of the Act – the minister has directive powers

The Library Board of Queensland is “subject to written directions of the Minister in exercising powers”.

I was hoping to chat with someone to confirm the below question re timeline.,,

The State government has confirmed the Arts Minister John-Paul Langbroek wrote to the library on Friday and on Monday to express his concerns about Karen Wyld receiving the award.

Can I confirm the library made the decision to revoke the award on Tuesday morning? Or was it earlier?

In the Queensland parliament yesterday (20 May), Minister Langbroek confirmed the Queensland Government had "taken the decision that this award should not be presented at the State Library".

Based on that decision, State Library yesterday morning postponed the black&white! ceremony and rescinded the fellowship to K.A. Ren Wyld.

My understanding is that Queensland State Library made the decision to revoke the fellowship due to Karen Wyld's social media comments around Gaza and Hamas. Just wanting to confirm it had nothing to do with the content in their novel *Whichway Shimmering Dust* (the manuscript which was nominated for black&white)

While I support the principles of free expression and creative diversity, publicly funded venues – including the State Library of Queensland – must be held to the highest standards. The Queensland government has called for the winner of a prestigious State Library Indigenous writing fellowship, who labelled the Hamas leader behind the October 7 attacks a “matryr”, to be stripped of the taxpayer-funded award.

Author Karen Wyld is one of two female writers set to receive the black & white! Writing Fellowship on Tuesday at a ceremony hosted by the Queensland State Library.

But Arts Minister John-Paul Langbroek has voiced concerns over social media posts made by the Aboriginal author, arguing they do not align with Queensland values by promoting division and hate.

Ms Wyld has made several posts in support of former Hamas leader Yahya Sinwar, the architect behind the militant group's October 7, 2023 attacks on Israel, which led to the deaths of hundreds of people and kicked off the ongoing conflict in the Middle East.

In the days [following Sinwar's death by Israeli forces last October](#), Ms Wyld wrote: "Vale to the martyr Sinwar. Resisting colonisation until his last breath, fighting the genocidal oppressors like a hero, sacrificing his life for love of his people and ancestral land".

She also reposted a “tribute for freedom fighter Yahya Sinwar” by Palestinian American author and activist for freedom Susan Abulhawa.

The black & white! Writing Fellowship carries \$15,000 prize money from federal body, Creative Australia. Judges described Ms Wyld’s work of fiction about the generational impact of forced child removals, *Whichway Shimmering Dust*, as “an ambitious, active work with a lot of heart”.

Mr Langbroek has written to State Library chairwoman Debbie Best and chief executive Vicki McDonald, calling on organisers to strip Ms Wyld of the award as her statements do not align with the values of the institution.

“The Premier and I have been unequivocal in stating that there is no place for hate, discrimination, or racism – including anti-Semitism – in Queensland. The Crisafulli Government supports the arts as a platform for creativity, expression, and cultural engagement,” Mr Langbroek wrote.



Queensland Jewish Board of Deputies president Jason Steinberg said organisations must do their due diligence on award nominees before making decisions with government funds.

“It’s deeply troubling for our community, when someone who uses their platform to spread like the inflammatory and divisive rhetoric, particularly against Israel, a Jewish country … be honoured with public funding,” Mr Steinberg said.

“She’s got form for repeatedly talking about Israel as a genocidal colonial regime. And that crosses the line into harmful vilification.”

The Jewish leader has echoed calls for the award to be revoked.

“We call on the State Library and any public institution not to reward the voices that alienate and target minority groups like ours,” Mr Steinberg said.

“It’s not about free speech, this is about vilification.”

Ms Wyld, a descendant of the Martu people of Western Australia, has written more than a dozen works of fiction, nonfiction and poetry.

Last year, she was awarded the South Australia Literary First Nations Fellowship and 2022 Tangkanungku Pintyanthi Literature Fellowship.

2. While a second writer was also nominated to receive a fellowship, this will not occur.
3. After consideration of some of the writer's previously made public statements, unrelated to the content of the manuscript, a decision was made not to award a second fellowship.
4. There is no place for hate, discrimination, or racism – including antisemitism – in Queensland.
5. The Queensland Government supports the arts as a platform for creativity, expression, and cultural engagement.
6. It is incumbent upon the Board to ensure that all activities and associations of the State Library reflect community standards and uphold the integrity of the institution

BACKGROUND

7. The announcement event for black&write! that was scheduled for today (20 May) in kuril dhagun, however will not proceed, with **s 47(3)(b) - Contrary to Public Interest** to be presented her fellowship on a rescheduled future date.
8. A second writer Karen Wyld was nominated for a fellowship.
9. Following a direction under Section 23 of the Libraries Act 1988 Minister Langbroek advised SLQ of his strong view that the award should not be presented to Ms Wyld or delivered to her within a publicly funded, state-run venue such as the State Library of Queensland.

10. Ms Wyld has made public statements supporting the person responsible for the horrific Hamas-led October 7 attacks, and issued a direction under Section 23 of the Libraries Act 1988 advising Ms Wyld should not receive the award in a Queensland Government or State Library of Queensland venue.
11. SLQ will contact staff and the Ms Wyld from 10am 20 May 2025 of the decision which may attract public discussion.
12. SLQ staff have been reminded of their Code of Conduct obligations and to not comment publicly on this matter.
13. black&write! is a highly respected national literary project led by State Library of Queensland.
14. Each year, two black&write! Fellowships are offered to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander writers. The winners each receive \$15,000, editorial development and a publication opportunity through publishing partner, University of Queensland Press (UQP).
15. The 2025 Fellowships are funded through a grant from Creative Australia, which also provides funding for nominees to attend the announcement event.
16. The State Library does not provide any direct cash to the Fellowships, however, provides in-kind support to administer the competition. The Senior Editor, black&write!, an employee of the State Library, provides editorial advice to the winners and is funded through State Library's administered grant.
17. Support is also provided by the Copyright Agency's Cultural Fund, which funds the engagement of two black&write! editor interns on a part-time basis.
18. If the manuscript is published, all associated publishing costs are met by UQP.
19. On 30 April 2025, the shortlist was announced online via the State Library webpages and promoted through social media and via electronic newsletters.
20. While manuscripts include authors' names, judges were not provided with any additional information about the authors.
21. The two winners chosen by the judging panel have been notified of the outcome.
22. Due diligence checks were undertaken on shortlisted applicants by the Government Research and Information Library team.
23. Announcement of winners
24. The two winners were to be announced by the State Librarian during an invitation only event at kuril dhagun, State Library of Queensland at 3pm on 20 May 2025. Approximately 80 attendees were expected for the event.

Hi media team, a story is due to go live this morning re the decision to withdraw Wyld's fellowship, i have included the statement posted by Vicki McDonald yesterday. If she would like to respond to the following allegations made by Wyld in the paragraph below, please respond as soon as you are able. Many thanks.

Wyld says she was ushered into a private room, where the state library's chief executive Vicki McDonald informed her that her scholarship, and a publishing contract that had already been signed by both parties, had been cancelled.

"She wouldn't tell me why or who was doing it...whether it was from the minister or the board," Wyld told the Guardian. "She just said it didn't come from her."

Wyld said she pointed out to McDonald that the withdrawal of the fellowship would add to an already increasingly divisive public debate over the attempt to silence artists' voices over their stance in the Gaza conflict.

McDonald said, words to the effect: "That's a risk we've decided that's worth taking."

Response:

In the Queensland parliament yesterday, Minister for Education and the Arts John-Paul Langbroek confirmed the Queensland Government had "taken the decision that this award should not be presented at the State Library". Based on that decision, the State Librarian and CEO Vicki McDonald and the Library Board of Queensland yesterday postponed the black&white! ceremony at State Library of Queensland.

Writer K.A. Ren Wyld, who was due to receive one of the fellowships, was asked to meet with Ms McDonald on Tuesday morning (21 May).

The difficult decision to rescind her fellowship was respectfully communicated to the writer at that time.

SLQ QLA judge resignations

Holding lines

- I respect the decision of individuals who have chosen to resign from the Queensland Literary Awards (QLAs) judging panel.
- I note State Library of Queensland (SLQ) has committed to an independent review of its full suite of awards including the QLAs, and I look forward to the outcomes of this review in due course.
- This review will consider the role of the State Library as a Queensland Government funded cultural institution in administering awards while balancing freedom of expression.
- The Queensland Government supports the arts as a platform for creativity, expression, and cultural engagement.
- However, I firmly believe there is no place for hate, discrimination, or racism – including antisemitism – in Queensland.
- It is my expectation that the Board ensures that all activities and associations of the State Library reflect community standards and uphold the integrity of the institution.

Background

- On 22 May 2025 SLQ has advised that three QLA judges, of a total of 35 judges across the award categories, have resigned. There is an expectation there may be further resignations.
- The Queensland Literary Awards started in its current form in 2015.
- Queensland Government funding was withdrawn from the Queensland Premier's Literary Awards (QPLA) in 2012.
- The writing sector re-established the former awards into the Queensland Literary Awards, and they were delivered by an independent body in 2012 and 2013 with funding by sponsors, donors and crowd funding.
- Since 2014 the QLAs have been managed by SLQ.
- Funding through the Department of the Premier and Cabinet was not reinstated, however Arts Queensland provided core funding for the Awards from 2015 including the establishment of two Queensland Premier's Awards categories:
 - the Queensland Premier's Young Publishers and Writers Awards
 - the Queensland Premier's Award for a Published Work of State Significance.
 - Queensland Government also supports the Queensland Writers Fellowships program.



- The QLAs provide fellowships and awards to outstanding Queensland and Australian writers in a range of genres.
- Nominations in each category are assessed by panels of independent expert judges from the literary sector.
- High profile previous winners include Melissa Lucashenko for Edenglassie (University of Queensland Press) and Sarah Holland-Batt for The Jaguar (University of Queensland Press).
- The Awards showcase outstanding authors from across Australia, celebrating emerging and established authors across a range of genres.
- There are 11 award categories.
- The total prize pool is more than \$260,000.

2025 AWARDS KEY DATES:

- Nominations opened on 3 March and closed on 17 April.
- Judging commenced on 6 May and is due to be completed on 14 July.
- The shortlist is planned to be announced on 5 August, with winners planned to be announced on 12 September at the State Library of Queensland.

FUNDING

- The Queensland Government currently provides \$230,000 (pa) to the State Library of Queensland to support the Queensland Literary Awards, which includes:
- \$30,000 for the Queensland Premier's Award for a Work of State Significance.
- \$30,000 for the Queensland Premier's Young Publishers and Writers Awards.
- \$45,000 for the Queensland Writers Fellowships.
- Up to \$125,000 in matched funding to match QLA nomination fees, cash sponsorships and donations secured by SLQ.

Dear Mr Langbroek

I write with grave concern at the interference of the state government in the SLQ literary awards. It is disappointing to see author Karen Wyld stripped of her award at the 11th hour. It smacks of McCarthyism for the state government to override the independent decision of the judges and to interfere in these awards.

In case you have forgotten, the last time the Qld state government interfered with the Qld literary awards, it was wildly unpopular. The LNP suffered a spectacular loss when they next went to the polls. Campbell Newman lost the safe seat of Ashgrove and the LNP were consigned to the wilderness.

That decision in 2012 was simply to cut the funding to the literary awards.

Given that this decision in 2025 seeks to muzzle artists for expressing sympathy for the suffering in Palestine, it seems the LNP has not learned the lessons of the past and you have failed to consider the potential political fallout.

I wonder if any of you have considered what the community sentiment may be in regard to Palestine, when we return to the polls in 2028. World leaders in the past week have been doing dramatic 180 turns on their past support for Israel.

By 2028, Netanyahu will have to front the courts in Israel on charges of fraud, and quite possibly for his role in failing to identify the risks that led to the attacks on October 7, 2023. The Israeli newspapers speak openly of how Apache helicopters incinerated hundreds of vehicles that were carrying Israeli citizens, whether through confusion (bad leadership) or due to the 'Hannibal Directive' which Israel has in the past used, to ensure that their own citizens are killed rather than allowing them to become hostages. Members of the IDF have spoken of how it is fanciful to consider that 200 armed militants on dirt bikes could have incinerated all the vehicles and residences that were reduced to burnt out husks on that day.

The ICC will be seeking to prosecute Netanyahu along with members of his cabinet and the IDF for a litany of war crimes. The killer of five year old Hind Rajab - who died waiting for an ambulance, has

been identified and a case is being built to prosecute him. There were 330 bullet holes in her vehicle, despite the Red Crescent being assured of safe passage to rescue her. The killers of Australian Aid worker Zomi Frankcom will also be prosecuted. She too was assured of safe passage. If this trial is making national headlines while your government is seeking re-election, I would not be surprised if you have an even worse score than Campbell Newman when the results come in.

On a global level, it seems unlikely that the USA will continue to support the Israeli settlement/expansion project, given that their president prefers to associate with governments that can bring wealth to the table, and he has very little interest in sustaining a relationship with those that are a political liability and which drain the US coffers.

These are very bad optics. I wonder if you are aware of the stories that are making International headlines. Israeli politicians and military leaders are accused of war crimes. The estimated number of real deaths in Gaza is over 300,000. Because it is impossible to identify displaced people, their bodies crushed beneath the rubble and blown apart by bombs, medics have been counting the dead by placing body parts in plastic bags - each 72 kilo bag is counted as a dead adult. Doctors who worked in Gaza have seen children under five being admitted with gunshots to the head and the chest which indicate that they have been deliberately targeted by snipers. Israeli politicians have been filmed saying that every child in Gaza must die, if they are to win the war. (That will be another ICC arrest warrant). Aid workers, medical workers, universities, schools, hospitals, places of worship, bakeries, food kitchens and water desalination plants have all been targeted and destroyed by the Israeli army. Lawyers are planning to create a war crime called 'Domicide' to provide accountability for regimes that seek to render a city uninhabitable. Only 4% of structures in Gaza have not sustained damage from attacks by Israel.


Karen Wyld was chosen for her work which shines a light on the stolen generations and on the government's inaction to implement the recommendations of the Bringing Them Home report. To punish her for one tweet - which she reconsidered and then deleted - seems ill-considered. This will not reflect well on the world stage. The literary community will take action to ensure that this decision gets international attention. If things transpire that she is given accolades by other states and other nations, and becomes a star at writers festivals all over the globe, your government has only itself to blame for giving in to lobbyists when you could have left well enough alone. A year or two from now, if her work becomes a best-seller, it will be thanks to the actions of the Queensland government and the Murdoch media, propelling her into the spotlight.

Authors and artists have a right to their own political opinions. Australians value our freedom and if the recent federal election has demonstrated anything, it is that mimicking the censorship and oppression of the Trump administration is a sure-fire way to lose an election.

I look forward to reading Karen Wyld's book and to hearing her speak at writers festivals over coming years, and I thank you for your service in ensuring she has a much wider readership, thanks to your ill-considered and draconian actions.



Dear Minister Langbroek,

I am writing to express my deep concern and strong objection to your government's decision to withdraw the black&write! fellowship from First Nations writer K A Ren Wyld, and the subsequent suspension of the State Library of Queensland's national Indigenous fellowships program.

I do not reside in your constituency, but write to you in your role as Minister for Education and the Arts. I have copied my local MP for their information.

This action represents a troubling departure from the principles of artistic freedom and creative expression that should be fundamental to any democratic society's approach to the arts. The decision to strip Ms Wyld of her \$15,000 fellowship, awarded solely on literary merit for her manuscript documenting seven generations of stolen Indigenous children, based on her personal views expressed on social media is both disproportionate and deeply concerning.

Your intervention demonstrates a fundamental misunderstanding of both the role of artists in society and misreads the current public sentiment regarding the situation in Gaza. Contrary to your assertion that this decision reflects "community standards," polling consistently shows that a significant portion of the Australian public holds serious concerns about Israel's actions in Gaza and supports calls for ceasefire and accountability. Many now have sympathy with the view that genocide is being committed by Israel in Gaza. It is true that Israel suffered an unprovoked attack

on 07th October 2023. However, the Israeli response has become, in my and many others' opinions, excessive with a disproportionate humanitarian toll. I do not personally agree with referring the the Hamas dead as Martyrs, but I can understand that to supporters, sympathises and religiously aligned people their deaths has elevated them in status to martyr and not eliminated them. Further, Israel has now been accused of committing genocide by the International Court of Justice, and Benjamin Netanyahu named a war criminal by the International Criminal Court. The Australian government is changing their rhetoric and has been calling on Israel to allow humanitarian aid and commit to a ceasefire. By silencing an Australian Indigenous voice speaking on issues of justice and human rights, your government appears remarkably out of touch with widely held community views, and could be seen as supporting genocide and war crimes.

The timing and manner of this decision, less than five hours before the ceremony, forcing Ms Wyld to learn of the cancellation through a journalist's inquiry, shows a callous disregard for the dignity of the recipient and the integrity of the awards process. This treatment of a First Nations artist, whose work specifically addresses the ongoing injustices faced by Indigenous communities through the Stolen Generations, is particularly troubling.

Furthermore, your characterisation of Ms Wyld's social media posts as "justifying terrorism" appears to be a significant overreach. Artists have historically played crucial roles in commenting on social and political issues, and the ability to express dissenting views, particularly on matters of international concern, should not disqualify them from recognition of their artistic merit.

The suspension of the entire Indigenous fellowships program and the uncertainty now cast over other awards represents collective punishment that will harm emerging First Nations writers and undermine Queensland's cultural landscape. This chilling effect on artistic expression serves no one's interests and damages Queensland's reputation as a place that values diverse voices and creative freedom.

I urge you to:

1. Immediately restore Ms Wyld's fellowship and allow the ceremony to proceed as planned. Sadly many of the judges have now resigned in protest.
2. Reinstate the Indigenous fellowships program without delay
3. Provide clear assurance that future arts funding decisions will not be subject to political interference based on artists' personal views on matters unrelated to their artistic work
4. Issue a public apology to Ms Wyld and the Queensland State Library for the inappropriate manner in which this situation was handled

The arts sector requires independence from political interference to thrive. This action is another of the state government's actions that set a dangerous precedent. This action threatens to transform Queensland's cultural institutions into vehicles for political censorship rather than platforms for artistic excellence and diverse expression.

I trust you will reconsider this decision and take immediate steps to restore confidence in Queensland's commitment to supporting its artists, particularly those from First Nations communities whose voices are essential to our cultural landscape.

I've just read about the rescinding of the black&write fellowship awarded to Ms K A Ren Wild.

As I understand, the State Library of Queensland rescinded the fellowship and the award ceremony was cancelled just yesterday only hours before the ceremony was to take place. The CEO of the library Ms Vicki McDonald stated the cancellation of the award was due to your interference. You referenced "community standards" in your reason for interfering in this arts award. The overwhelming majority of community standards would support the idea that institutions such as the State Library of Queensland should be independent from government interference.

I presume this quote in the Guardian is correct:

"Whilst I support the principles of free expression and creative diversity, any perception that taxpayer-funded awards being granted to individuals who justify terrorism undermines public trust, both in our institutions and in the cultural sector more broadly"

She was awarded this grant for the merit of her work. She had flown from her home to formally receive the grant award and recognition of her work, yet on the night she was told she would NOT be given that grant.



As a resident of Queensland [REDACTED] I'm writing regarding the recent decision to rescind Ren Wyld's black&write! fellowship.

This decision is a flagrant abuse of authority, and a complete disrespect to the shared solidarity and struggles of Indigenous peoples in resisting their own genocide (both within Australia and abroad in Palestine).

Since October 7th 2023 there has been an acceleration in Israel's assaults on Gaza, leading to a recorded death toll in the tens of thousands - although the true number is likely much higher, and remains uncounted due to the destruction of critical Gazan infrastructure by Israel. This is to say nothing of the many human rights violations across broader Palestine since the early 1900s, beginning before the Nakba and subsequent establishment of the colonial state of Israel. There has been little-to-no worthwhile response from international leaders, even in the height of Israel's atrocities towards the Palestinian people. More generally, leaders the world over have aided and abetted Israel's crimes. And specifically, there has been punishment and censorship of those who condemn or resist genocide by leaders such as yourself - however mealy-mouthed. This will be your legacy.

As a local resident, worker connected to the arts communities, and advocate for a free Palestine, I am disgusted by your response to the State Library of QLD's decision, and consider you therefore equally responsible for rescinding Ren Wyld's fellowship.
