The school's Parent Information Booklet also outlines these policies and procedures.

This booklet is given to parents on enrolment and parents agree to follow the policies and procedures of the school before enrolling their child.

Page 12 of the Parent Information Booklet outlines the uniform and dress code policy.

It specifically states that "extreme hairstyles" such as mohawks, shaved sections and rat's tails are not permitted at the school.

The Principal has met with the parent of the student and spoken with them about the dress code policy and what action could be taken under the Education (General Provision) Act 2006 if it was not followed.

Uniform and dress standards have been communicated to parents and students on a number of occasions; however this term action has been taken.

Consequences, such as detentions, are never given during valuable lesson times. Our school values the importance of education and will ensure every student has the opportunity to access learning.

The P&C met on Monday night and the issue of rat's tails being prohibited was raised as a concern by one parent. The P&C indicated at that meeting, that they would review the policy and openly canvas parents and staff thoughts on the matter in order to determine if a motion should be passed to vote on making any changes to the code.




