



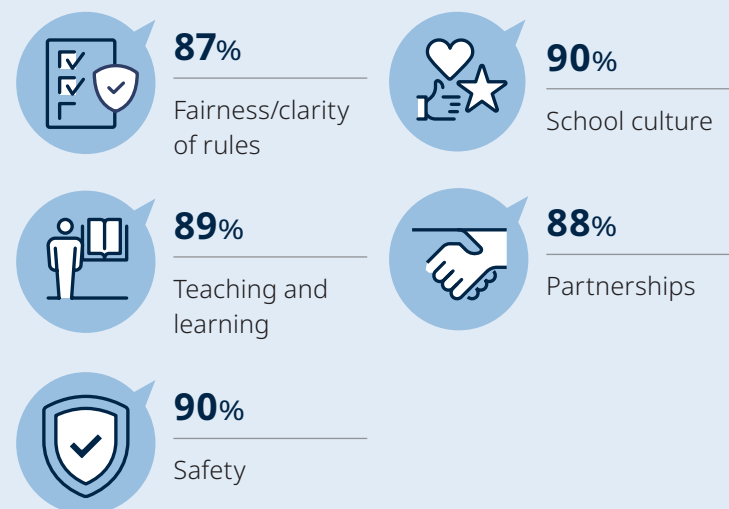

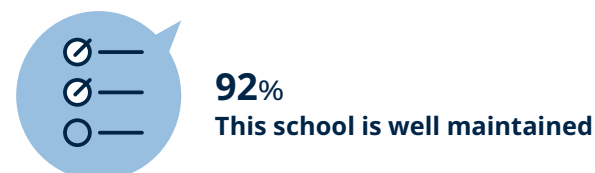
In Term 3, 2025, the Department of Education conducted its annual School Opinion Survey, inviting students, parents and staff to have **their say about schooling and learning at their school.**

How we are doing in all areas — overall level of agreement

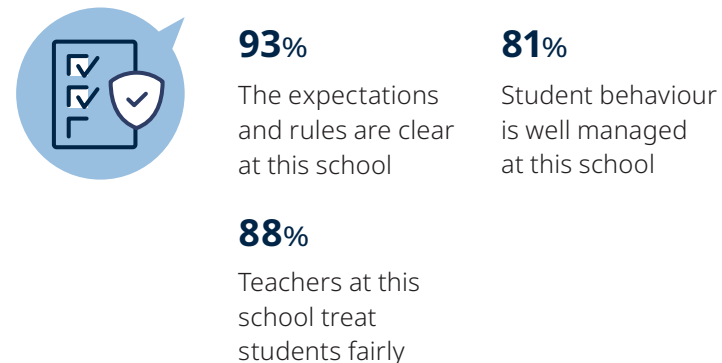
