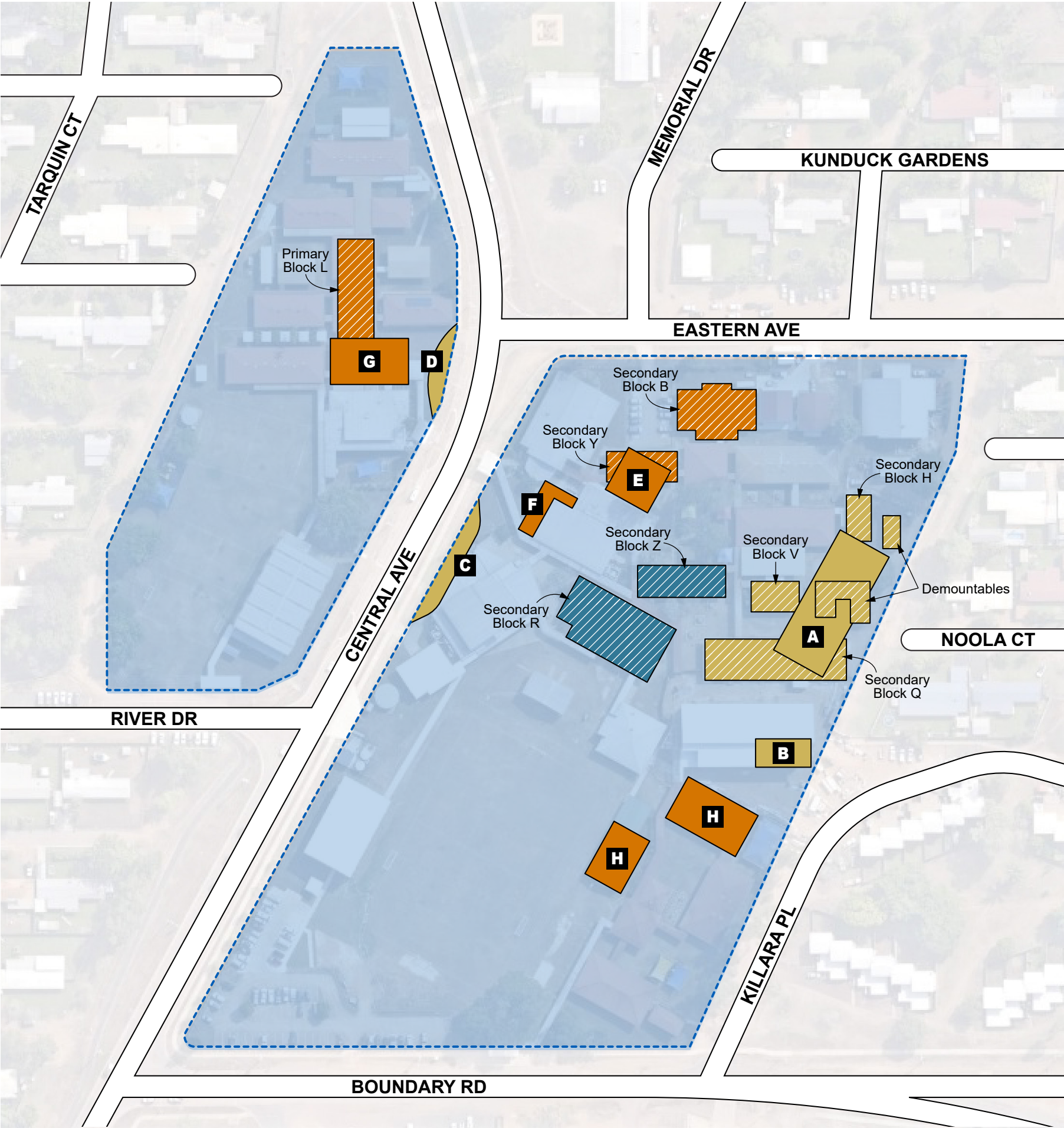
Next steps:

STAGE 1 POTENTIAL PROJECTS

- A** New specialist hub precinct for Manual Arts, Science and Art
- B** Build classrooms underneath Block P
- C** New pick-up/drop-off for secondary school
- D** New pick-up/drop-off for primary and special education
- To be demolished:
 - Secondary Block H, Block Q and Block V
 - Demountables

STAGE 2 POTENTIAL PROJECTS

- E** New community allied health and enrichment centre
- F** Extension to the existing secondary Administration building
- G** New primary Administration building, amenities and covered area
- H** Clontarf and S.T.A.R.S. facilities to be refurbished with updated kitchen and amenities
- To be demolished:
 - Secondary Block B and Block Y
 - Primary Block L

STAGE 3 POTENTIAL PROJECTS

- To be demolished:
 - Secondary Block R and Block Z to increase visibility through the school
