Original incident report has been input by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to]. There is evidence that [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] initiated a verbal altercation with [s.47(3)(b) – C] where both [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) – C] called each other a range of names and made derogatory comments about each other's families. It appears that [s.47(3)(b) –] initiated the confrontation by removing [s.47(3)(b) – Co] hat outside of the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] after class had been dismissed. [s.47(3)(b) –] had tried to diffuse the situation in class by stating to the pair "...Stop talking about your fucking mums."

[s.47(3)(b) – C] was the first student to physically attack another student by punching and kicking. He threatened students with scissors and attacked students and teacher with [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] on two separate occasions in the brief altercation.

[s.47(3)(b) –] was involved in the physical altercation in that he pulled [s.47(3)(b) – C] off [s.47(3)(b) –], and pushed [s.47(3)(b) – C] away several times as [s.47(3)(b) – C] was trying to punch him.

[s.47(3)(b) –] punched [s.47(3)(b) – C] in the face after he was hit several time with a [s.47(3)(b) – Contr]

Throughout the day [s.47(3)(b)] had been unsettled. DP had phoned [s.47(3)(b)] in the morning to advise that school staff were concerned as [s.47(3)(b)] anger and behaviour had escalated in the last couple of weeks.

[s.47(3)(b)] refused to go. He tried to knock [s.47(3)(b) – Co] off her computer chair. He was redirected to the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] He
refused to comply and tipped over a computer chair and [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] desk. He tried to tip [s.47(3)(b) – Co] off her
computer chair but flipping the wheels. [s.47(3)(b) – Co] sat down and it pinched [s.47(3)(b)] fingers. He starting screaming and
crying. [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] walked him to First Aid for ice and back to class. I gave [s.47(3)] a stack of books to read at [s.47(3)(b)]

and slammed it onto my desk. I handed him a new Maths sheet and said do it again that is not your best work. I put
the first sheet in the bin. [s.47(3)(b)] started screaming at me, "I don't care". [s.47(3)(b)] walked away and took a pointing stick off
the chalkboard. [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] called out to me to "Watch Out". I turned and saw [s.47(3)(b)] holding the stick above his head
with two arms preparing to hit me. I stated, " Don't hit your teacher [s.47(3)(b)] you will be suspended". [s.47(3)(b)] smashed the
stick into my lounge chair and broke off the end of the stick. He tried to put the stick over his knee to snap it. I told [s.47(3)(b)]
to put the stick down. [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] talked [s.47(3)(b)] into giving the stick to her. We evacuated the class outside. [s.47(3)(b) – Contra]
stayed with the group. I walked [s.47(3)(b)] to [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] room for buddy class. He refused to enter. I returned to class and

[s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the P] was called from duty under C Block to attend [s.47(3)(b) –] who had been walking along the front boundary of the school with a stick. Upon walking down the path at the front of the school, [s.47(3)(b) –] saw [s.47(3)(b) –] walking back into the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public] with a long stick. He proceeded to walk into the school with the stick, through and under C Block and under D Block, where [s.47(3)(b) –] took the stick off him and placed it in the rubbish bin. [s.47(3)(b) –] proceeded to run away toward the front of the school. [s.47(3)(b) –] slipped on the wet pavers outside on the footpath, injuring his knee slightly. [s.47(3)(b) –] followed and met [s.47(3)(b) –] in the side garden of the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Int]. [s.47(3)(b) –] then ran away through the side walkway near C block and hid in the excess furniture under F Block. DP found him and requested he come to the office as a safe place. [s.47(3)(b) –] ran away and up the stairs outside [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]. [s.47(3)(b) –] then picked up a long piece of downpipe and began to walk down the stairs towards where the Year [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) –] students were eating lunch. [s.47(3)(b) –] disarmed [s.47(3)(b) –] and he ran up the stairs and along the verandah towards the other stairs. Along the way he threw at least two school bags from other students downstairs and into the gardens. Principal [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to th] went to other stairs to stop [s.47(3)(b) –] from running away again. [s.47(3)(b) –] jumped up onto the port racks ready to jump over the side when [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) –] stopped him. [s.47(3)(b) –] immediately become violent and stuck out at both [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) –] biting, punching, spitting etc. Both [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) –] were forced to restrain [s.47(3)(b) –] and sit him on the verandah. He refused to comply with our instructions and began screaming and yelling at a very high level. [s.47(3)(b) –] had to be restrained for a period of 15 minutes and was not calming down. We attempted to move [s.47(3)(b) –] to the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to th] however it was locked so we moved him down the stairs towards the office. He refused to comply with our instructions and attempted to kick and bite us both. Upon reaching the office, [s.47(3)(b) –] refused to sit on the chair and was highly aggressive towards us both having to be restrained again. He attempted to kick, punch, head butt and spit at both [s.47(3)(b) –] and [s.47(3)(b) –] until after 10 minutes he calmed down and [s.47(3)(b) –] got an ice pack for his knee and hand. He layed down in the corner to rest and he had a glass of water. [s.47(3)(b) –] appeared tired and rested for a brief period.

On the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] had made threats to bring a knife to school and "kill [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]". [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] had made threats similar to this for the week. On the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] showed at least 5 students that she had brought a knife to school within her lunch box and that she intended to "scare or kill [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]". [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] initially denied the fact that she brought it along to hurt [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] but then admitted to bringing it to school. She initially said that her [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] had put it in her lunch. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] denied this during a phone call made by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] admitted to then bringing the knife out at lunch break and showing the knife to other students and saying she was going get [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] placed the knife back in her bag. The knife was retrieved by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] after [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] asked her for it. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] then reported the knife to [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] on duty under D Block at first break. The knife was brought to the office immediately.

He spent 1st break at [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] as a result of [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] behaviour (see report) and generally roamed the room for most of the morning. He received 2 timeouts for rudeness.

[s.47(3)(b)] was reported throwing rocks and sticks at children in the playground. When I arrived to collect my class he ran around the group stepping on children and when approached ran away, collected rocks from the gardens and roadway and began to throw them at students and teachers. [s.47(3)(b)] ran away around the [s.47(3)(b)] building when approached. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] took the class to [s.47(3)(b)] lessons (not our normal time) and I went to the office to ask for help retrieving [s.47(3)(b)] [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] and [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] came to help find him. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] also rang the office to report [s.47(3)(b)] running around outside threatening children with rocks.

After a brief search, [s.47(3)(b)] was found inside the classroom threatening to throw rocks at [s.47(3)(b)] (student teacher). He then proceeded to run repeatedly at the wall, impacting heavily. [s.47(3)(b)] left the room and [s.47(3)(b)] was escorted to the office by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] and myself. [s.47(3)(b)] did not answer [s.47(3)(b)] phone but a message was left requesting early pick up and a meeting with admin upon arrival.

The teacher shadowed [s.47(3)(b)] and asked him to return to class. [s.47(3)(b)] said that he wanted to talk to the Principal because he did not like a new school rule. The teacher offered to take [s.47(3)(b)] to the Principal. [s.47(3)(b)] said that he was going to 'kill her' (the Principal) and went to the kitchen located in K block and got a butter knife. The teacher directed [s.47(3)(b)] to put the knife away and he dropped it on the floor. The teacher then restrained [s.47(3)(b)] until he stopped hitting her. She then let him go and he left the school grounds. Two teachers shadowed him until his [s.47(3)(b)] arrived.

He was swinging this around, demonstrating practice shots at hitting somebody. Whilst doing this, he particularly focussed his sights on the children in the classes whom he most despises. The first group of students (Year [s.47(3)(b)] boys) were now nearing [s.47(3)(b)] position and I realised that I needed to put myself between him and the runners. He moved out from under the tree to be nearer to the boys, whilst swinging the stick. [s.47(3)(b)] was about 1-2 metres away from me. I commanded him several times to put down the stick, threatening him with suspension. At this point I was convinced that he was going to hit me with the stick. After glaring at me menacingly and at the boys he wanted to get at, he eventually put the stick down and climbed up another tree. I called for [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] from the classroom, who came and talked [s.47(3)(b)] down from the tree. She then took him back to the classroom.

I stayed and read with him and left when it was time for the class to go to [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]. After a few minutes, [s.47(3)(b)] turned up at the [s.47(3)(f)]. He was angry. [s.47(3)(b)] and I told him he needed to calm down. However, he got up and left the room to return to where his class was. He was targeting a student in his class. [s.47(3)(b)] and I followed and redirected him back to the [s.47(3)(f)]. At this time [s.47(3)(b)] got a drink of water and spat it directly at a teacher and students working on the verandah outside a classroom. The teacher took the full force of the spray. I followed [s.47(3)(b)] and told him he would be going home because of the incident. [s.47(3)(b)] said does that mean I'm suspended. I said probably. On arrival at the [s.47(3)(f)] I rang [s.47(3)(f)] and [s.47(3)(f)] said [s.47(3)(b)] was on [s.47(3)(b)] way. [s.47(3)(b)] began to cry. When I told [s.47(3)(b)] that [s.47(3)(b)] was on [s.47(3)(b)] way, he said he didn't want to go home. He did not appear to understand that he was most probably suspended. He began to throw things around the room. He pushed over a bookshelf and broke a teacher's personal photoframe. I told him what ever mess he made he would have to clean it up. He finally calmed and walked into the [s.47(3)(b)] area. he took a knife out of the drawer and put it to his throat. I went to ring the office, [s.47(3)(b)] said to call the police. At this [s.47(3)(b)] put the knife down and left the [s.47(3)(b)]. He began to clean up the mess that he had made. My response was to stand and firmly say that it was my job to watch him and keep him safe.

He came back to the seating area outside the room and sat down. I started to speak to him and he told me that his teacher didn't keep her promise. He went over to the class room and started kicking the door again. I told him to stop but he continued telling me to stop following him and using his repeated swearing words. He then walked away and found one of the large thick sticks he had previously thrown and threw it at me - this time it hit me on my left leg. I did not feel safe.

He walked away and went over the fence outside the [s.47(3)(b)] building. He walked down to the oval but came back to the area around E Block. He climbed under the safety fence of the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] and went up on the 'out of bounds' area of the [s.47(3)(b)] building. I told him he was breaking the law and that he was not safe. His response was that he didn't care. He came out of the [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]

He found another large thick stick and walked up to me and threatened me with the stick - shaking it in my face suggesting he would hit me. He did not hit me. (This was witnessed by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest])

At this stage I asked [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] who was in one of the D Block classrooms to tell all occupants of E and D Blocks to stay inside to keep all children safe.

He then said he was going to climb [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest]. He then took his shoes off and climbed [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] of E Block. He threw several items (including sticks, a hat and a large solid wooden block - which missed me by only centimeters) from the roof.

One is at the front of the room for the teacher and there are [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] on each side of the room for students with [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] the room. The activity required the class to be split into 6 groups corresponding to 6 science activities. I was at the back left hand side of the room (the left hand side was from my perspective and corresponded to the western side of the room) monitoring the work station at that location. My focus was across the room (the right hand side of the room facing to the front) which corresponded to the middle work station on the opposite side of the room. A boy, [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] was sitting at this work station. At the time I was watching him, he was neither misbehaving nor talking and appeared to have his focus of attention on the activity in front of him. Without warning he was hit on the arm by a pair of scissors which appeared to be thrown from the opposite side of the room, (the side I was sitting on). I did not observe who had thrown the scissors but realized that they had to have come from one of the [s.47(3)] work stations on my side of the room in front of me. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary] arm jerked involuntarily and his arm hit a glass rod sitting on the table. (This was a specialized piece of equipment related to work on static electricity. It was of larger than average diameter and had rounded ends for safety). The rod then rolled off the table and shattered on the floor. I questioned the five girls who were sitting at the [s.47(3)] work stations immediately in front of me but although it was generally acknowledged that the scissors had been thrown from their location, no one admitted being personally responsible. I reported the incident to [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] the Deputy Principal at the end of the lesson. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] asked me to collect written statements from the girls at the next lesson and give them to her. This I did. Subsequent to this, I was advised by [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] that the person responsible had admitted to throwing the scissors.

They had to be instructed a number of times to settle down and take turns. The boys refused to agree not to take the incident further and continued to be aggressive towards [s.47(3)(b)]. The boys were then offered turns at taking a break for lunch so that they would not be in the grounds together. [s.47(3)(b)] was offered first turn. He indicated that he did not have lunch and did not want a break. [s.47(3)(b)] was then offered time to go out to lunch. He did. 5 min later [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] and [s.47(3)(b)] started complaining loudly that they wanted to leave to go out to lunch. They were told to sit quietly as they were taking turns. Over the next 40 mins the boys continued to complain, make silly animal noises, wander the hallway, and threaten not to stay in the office, despite being repeatedly told by the Deputies to sit quietly. The boys also talked about [s.47(3)(b)] all saying things like, "He gonna get killed. He gonna get raped". [s.47(3)(b) –] said "If I get suspended I will get [s.47(3)] and beat him up" [s.47(3)(b)] said "If I'm suspended I'll Kick his head in" and kicked a chair to demonstrate. At one point [s.47(3)(b)] said "let's go get the fucker" and walked out down the hallway with the two boys following. I told him to come back and followed him to the door when he didn't. The other two boys turned and went back. I told [s.47(3)(b)] that if he went looking for [s.47(3)] and didn't come back to the office like I said the he may not be able to come back to this school at all. He then turned and went back into the office. Due to the non-compliance and continued threat-making the boys were to be sent home rather than detained at school. The [s.47(3)(b)] called [s.47(3)(b) –] home to get permission to take him home. When she returned with permission I told [s.47(3)(b)] that he would be going home and that [s.47(3)] was to contact me about him returning. [s.47(3)(b)] refused to leave the office and go home despite the [s.47(3)(b)] and I trying to persuade him that it was in his best interests. [s.47(3)(b)] revealed that [s.47(3)(b)] had a screwdriver in his bag that he had pulled out and shown when the boys had been talking about 'getting' [s.47(3)(b)] [s.47(3)(b)] got angry and paced the hallway refusing to follow instruction and threatening to leave without the [s.47(3)(b)] [s.47(3)(b)] and [s.47(3)(b)] verbally egged [s.47(3)(b)] on. The [s.47(3)(b)] was called. At [s.47(3)(b)] [s.47(3)(b)] left the office to get his bike. I followed and watched him get his bike. I told him to go straight home. He rode off out of the grounds. At [s.47(3)(b)] [s.47(3)(b)] appeared climbing the wall/window outside my office and the [s.47(3)(b) –] room. He stayed there for approx 10-15 min banging on the windows and yelling through them. After approximately 10 – 15min of further negotiations [s.47(3)(b)] threw the knife (a folding knife with the blade exposed) violently under the door just missing my left leg. I picked up the knife and asked [s.47(3)(b)] to come out and that he had done the right thing. He refused to come out and was telling me, in course language, to go away. He was also very concerned about getting his knife back.

I then explained that I needed to check he had not cut or hurt himself and that I was not going away. After more negotiations he showed me his arms under the door. I told him it didn't count and I still wasn't going away.

He kept saying that [s.47(3)(b)] picked on him all the time. He could not be calmed and he stood up and said he was going out to break whether we liked it or not. We let him go. At session 3 we arranged for [s.47(3)(b) – Contra] to come down to his class and assist with getting [s.47(3)(b)] to the office. [s.47(3)(b)] came. His [s.47(3)(b)] was called and he was sent home.

Once at the bus, the children were getting on and he grabbed the back of my bus roll and ripped a note up that was in the back of it and threw it on the ground. He then said he would kick the bus. Then he went over to a tree nearby and pulled the branches around. He kicked a thick wooden stake and hurt his foot as a result. He was crying and I said he needed to get on the bus. I told the bus driver that we had had some trouble and he put [s.47(3)(b)] at the front of the bus. I told [s.47(3)(b)] that we don't behave that way at this school. The [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary] on [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] was witness to some of this behaviour as were many of the students in the bus line.

He got down from the awning when asked to, and began swearing at staff and demanding to have access to his bag, which was in the locked classroom with the other students and staff. [s.47(3)(b) - C] and [s.47(3)(b) - Contrary to] were observing.

[s.47(3)(b) - C] informed [s.47(3)(b) - C] that he was disrupting the class and behaving in an unsafe manner. She told him that she could return his bag to him once he demonstrated that he could enter the room safely.

7. He went & sat down when I told him to. He called a student 'Durnh arse' and another to shut up.
8. Before the bell rang I told him & two other boys that they were on detention .When the bell rang I told him to wait behind. I instructed him to get his lunch & go & sit outside the office as I knew he would make poor choices if allowed to go to the lunch area.
9. He refused to leave the classroom & said he would not do detention.
10. I tried to contact his [s.47(3)(b) –] & left a 10 second message that said it was [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to] ringing from [s.47(3)(b) – Cont] [s.47(3)(b)] I decided that I would not try to ring [s.47(3)(b) –] again but would go and see if he went to detention.
11. I told [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to th] the teacher on duty the situation & I informed the staff in the staffroom that he was being non compliant & that if he didn't go to detention I would ring his [s.47(3)(b) –] to come & pick him up.

With prompts and verbal reminders, [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] eventually came to reading groups. He worked through his first rotation and then refused to do any more work, "I NOT doing more work". He stomped on the floor, threw his book, crossed his arms and screamed, "I going to the toilet!" We calmed his engine down, talked about doing the NEXT rotation and THEN going to the toilet. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] sat at his desk away from the other group of children. He continued to talk about not working but was sitting at his desk in front of his book. [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] and I ignored his chatting. After several minutes, he threw a pair of scissors across the room at me, taking me by surprise and hitting me in the chest. I immediately jumped up and redirected him out of the room. He started screaming jibberish at us and then repeatedly kicked the classroom door until [s.47(3)(b) – Contrary to the Public Interest] arrived.

For approximately 10 minutes [s.47(3)(b) – C] continued to walk around the perimeter of the building, attempting to gain entry by banging on windows and doors, trying to open doors, all the while continuing to make verbal and non-verbal threats.

During this time, [s.47(3)(b) – C] noticed a knife on the ground. He picked up the knife and repeatedly said "I'm going to kill him", "I will cut his head off". He continued to say these things as he walked around the building. He went to the window of the principal's office and held the knife up and gestured threateningly. Both boys in the office saw this. He continued to walk around the building with the knife.

After approximately 20 minutes [s.47(3)(b) – C] calmed and became more responsive to requests and offers of support. He dropped the knife when requested to give it to me. He picked it back up and threw it onto the walkway roof.
